**Project:**

**Bridge S-07 Concrete Barrier Installation**  
 Stillwater Road (CR-521), Stillwater Township

**Construction Forces:**

- Sussex County Division of Public Works
- Sussex County Office of Bridge & Traffic Safety

**Advisory:**

- A MVA (Motor Vehicle Accident) in April 2013 resulted in damage to the upstream masonry parapet on Bridge S-07 in Stillwater.
- In order to maintain continued long-term safe vehicular use, concrete construction barrier curb (jersey barriers) and beam guide rail have been installed along the existing damaged parapets.

**Schedule:**

- Construction Start Date: Monday, August 5<sup>th</sup>
- Construction Completion & Road Opening Date: **Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup>**

**Traffic Control (Bridge Closure & Detour):**

- **As of Friday, August 9, Bridge S-07 has Been Reopened to Traffic as a One Lane Bridge**

**Work Activities:**

- ✓ Install Single Lane Bridge advance warning signs – *Complete*
- ✓ Install Detour Signage – *Complete*
- ✓ Install advanced notice Variable Message Board - *Complete*
- ✓ Install Concrete Construction Barrier Curb (Jersey Barrier) - *Complete*
- ✓ Install/Replace Beam Guide Rail at Bridge Approaches - *Complete*
