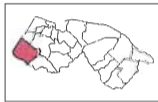
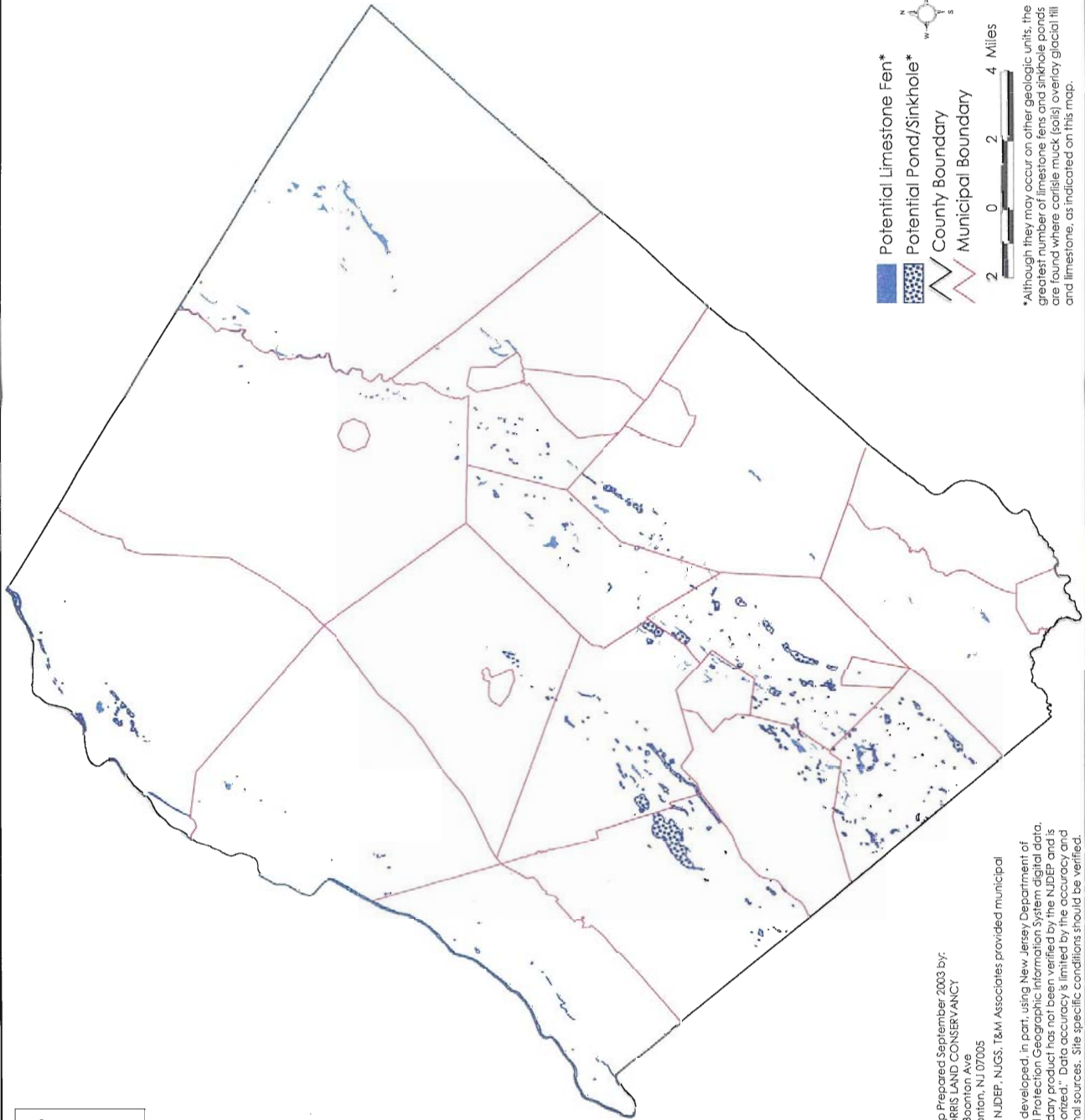


MAP 14:
