What is the New Jersey Watershed Stewards program?

The *New Jersey Watershed Stewards* program is an educational extension program developed by the Rutgers Cooperative Extension Water Resources Program that empowers citizens of New Jersey to take action to be part of the solution to the watershed problems throughout the State. To obtain the title of "New Jersey Watershed Steward," participation in a training workshop and a watershed-based apprenticeship project are required. At the training workshop for Sussex County, experts from Rutgers Cooperative Extension and the Walkkill River Watershed Management Group will go over the basics of watersheds: what they are, how they are affected, and approaches to take care of them. During the training workshop, the various apprenticeship projects for the watersheds of Sussex County will be described and you will have the opportunity to sign up for a project that interests you. All are welcome and previous environmental experience is not required.
